IMPORTANT SCHOOL NOTICES & REMINDERS [©] See previous Newsletters emailed to you and on our website. 2025 Y7/8 Immunisations: We have been informed from Te Whatu Ora, that these immunisations will take place next February, March, June and December. If you have any queries, please call the Office.

Student arrival and leaving times

- Please arrive by 8:30 am. School starts 8:55 am and finishes 3 pm.
- If late, students must sign in at the Library and go straight to class (learning time has already begun)
- If you need to collect your child earlier for an appointment, call the Office in advance. Children must be collected and signed out from the Office only between 11:30 to 11:45 am
- 3 pm is home time for all students. There is no supervision after school. No students should return to School after hours. Let's all keep safe.
- Safely walk on the paths and use the pedestrian crossing

Drop off / Pick up:

- Only use the Manukau Rovers car parks and/or surrounding streets. When parked in Rovers,
 please follow the safety layout, traffic flow, exits and staff on duty. No stopping or parking at the cones

 health promoting School, please consider healthy snack options, rather than highly processed foods

Uniform, stationery & devices:

- Viscount School uniform is compulsory. Please purchase the <u>collar top</u>, with the shorts. The <u>Sports Tee is only</u> for Y7/8. The hat is compulsory for all students Term 1 & 4. Black sandals Term 1 and 4 or dark/black shoes <u>NO</u> <u>crocs</u> or 'rolling ball' shoes (these are unsafe). The fleece pullover full zip is compulsory for Term 2 and 3. Students can wear the free black jacket or the uniform jacket. Black trousers are optional in Term 2 and 3.

Notice of Asbestos Removal Work

To the Viscount School community,

Reliable Contracting Group Limited a licensed Asbestos Removalist (WorkSafe Class A Licence: number RA21090043 & Class B Licence: number RB20040012 will be undertaking removal work of some Asbestos Containing Materials (ACMs) from Viscount Primary School, Main Building, Ground Floor, Room 7.

This removal work will be conducted between the hours of **6** AM to **6** PM on **12/04/2025**, and is expected to finish on **26/04/2025**. This work may need to be re-scheduled in the event of bad weather.

WorkSafe NZ was notified on **00158045** that this licensed asbestos removal work is to be undertaken.

Viscount Primary School management and Board have been consulted about the nature and timing of this work, together with the safety measures to be used.

The following safety measures will be put in place and maintained for the duration of this project:

- Signs, barriers and/or temporary fencing will be installed.
- PVA solution or water will be applied to asbestos containing materials to prevent airborne asbestos fibres dust (as required).
- Asbestos containing materials will not be broken, where possible.
- Plastic will be used to cover horizontal surfaces and surrounds.
- Asbestos containing material will be wrapped on site and disposed of at an approved tip site
- Air monitoring at the work site boundary will be place for the duration of the work. If asbestos fibres above the allowable safe limit are detected, work will cease immediately and corrective measures applied
- An independent party will carry out an inspection of the site on completion of the work, and issue a clearance certificate.

Dear Parents and Guardians

Important Notice – Road closure affecting travel time to and from school

Auckland Council will be starting construction on the Te Ararata Creek Flood Resilience Project mid-2025. To complete this work as quickly as possible we need to close the Walmsley Road Bridge to road traffic for up to seven months.

We want to inform you about an upcoming traffic detour that may affect travel times to and from school.

Key Information:

Affected Areas

- Walmsley Road will be closed to all vehicles between McKenzie Road and Hall Avenue from late July 2025 to February 2026.
- A traffic detour will be put in place, which means more vehicles will use Bader Drive, Elmdon Street and Hall Avenue. There will be signs in place telling you where the detour is.
- You will still be able to walk or cycle along Walmsley Road as a temporary pedestrian bridge will be provided.

Expected Delays

• Travelling by car or bus might take longer, so please allow extra time.

School Bus Services

- 309 and 309x will be re-routed and will not stop at the bus stops near Hall Avenue, near the Mangere Samoan Church and near the Mobil gas station.
- School buses will still be able to use these bus stops.

We understand these changes may cause inconvenience, and we appreciate your patience and cooperation. Our priority is ensuring that all students can continue to travel to school safely and efficiently.






Temporary Traffic Diversions: July 2025 – February 2026

The Viscount School uniform is <u>compulsory</u>.
