Student arrival and leaving times


- Students arrive by 8:30 am. School starts 9 am and finishes 3 pm

- 3 pm is home time for all students. There is no supervision after school. No students should return to School after hours. Let's all keep safe
- Safely walk on the paths and use the pedestrian crossing


Drop off / Pick up:


- Only use the Manukau Rovers car parks and/or surrounding streets. When parked in Rovers,

Uniform, stationery & devices:

Black sandals Term 1 and 4 or black shoes <u>NO crocs</u> or 'rolling ball' shoes (these are unsafe). The fleece full zip is compulsory for Term 2 and 3. Students can wear the free black jacket (ask at the Office). Black trousers are optional in Term 2 and 3

- We supply free stationery for your child upon enrolment
